This course is designed to provide workers with the knowledge and practical skills to the level ARAA Level 2 Rope Access Advanced Operator & Basic Site Supervisor. At the completion of a successful level 2 assessment Operators may supervise workers on a 'basic' site and may also work under the supervision of a Level 3 Operator on an 'Advanced' site.



CERTIFICATION

Students that are deemed competent will receive an industry qualification from ARAA at Level 2 mapped against AS/NZS 4488 Industrial Rope Access Systems.

PREREQUISITE

Current (within 24 months) Nationally Accredited Work Safely at Heights certificate in addition to 500 hours and 6 months of documented industrial rope access experience as a Level 1 Technician or equivalent.

COURSE DURATION

The course runs for five days. It comprises of four days of training and a one day assessment.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

Upon successful completion, candidates will gain knowledge of:

Theory

- Complete & maintain site records
- Interpret legal requirements
- Carry out site risk assessment and create JSA/SWMS/Risk Assessments
- Create site specific rescue plan
- Supervision of personnel/ equipment/materials
- Conduct roping activity briefings and implement procedures on site

Practical

- Intermediate knots and rope management
- Loop traverse
- Aid climbing (vertical/horizontal/diagonal)
- Advanced rigging and anchoring principles
- Installation of deviations & diversions
- Operate lowering and hauling systems (simple & compound M.A.)
- Rescue past knots, re-anchors and diversions (ascend and descend)

Assessment

Students will be assessed by an independent assessor to determine their competency as a Level 2 operator both theoretically and practically.

The written test (theory assessment) and practical assessment shall be representative of the skills and knowledge required by ARAA as outlined in the ARAA Codes of Practice and ARAA Safe Practices for Rope Access Work.

The practical assessment will require students to demonstrate the skills learnt during training. These will include advanced rigging, aid climbing manoeuvres as required and rescue techniques appropriate to Level 2.
